Shakira Henderson is a nurse scientist, associate professor and subject matter expert in pediatric/neonatal nursing and research. Dr. Henderson holds a Doctor of Philosophy, Doctor of Nursing Practice, Masters of Science in Anatomy, Masters of Public Health and Masters of Science in Nursing with a sub-specialization in education. She became an IBCLC in 2010 and has received several awards for her work with breastfeeding innovation projects and promotional activities. She was responsible for leading a six hospital system-wide breastfeeding initiative which led to the first Babyfriendly hospital in the state of South Florida. A nationally known speaker and educator, Shakira is a frequent presenter at national, international nursing and multidisciplinary conferences.

Shakira is the Senior Systems Administrator for Grants and Research at Vidant Health, an invited faculty member of Sigma Theta Tau International Maternal-Child Leadership Fellowship, an appointed Board Member of the International Board of Lactation Consultant Examiners and a professional journal reviewer, writer and researcher.
