Relational connection is the most powerful intervention with patients, particularly patients who have experienced trauma. As helping professionals, the rate at which we come into contact with patients who have been impacted by traumatic experiences is rising. We have a unique ability to support patients relationally which decreases the likelihood of developing trauma-related symptoms. Conference attendees will identify the difference between shock trauma and complex trauma, as well as the manner in which symptoms may manifest in children. Together we will look at how we already possess the most powerful tool that decreases children's likelihood of developing trauma-related symptoms- ourselves.

Objectives

This conference is designed to increase knowledge, skills and professional growth for social workers, nurses and allied health professionals.

Participants will describe:

- The difference between shock trauma and complex/ongoing trauma.
- How symptoms of shock trauma may manifest in children.
- How symptoms of ongoing/complex trauma may manifest in children.
- What children need in the aftermath of a trauma to decrease the probability of developing trauma-related symptoms.
- How helping professionals can increase felt-safety for children who have experienced either shock or ongoing traumas.

Robyn works with young children and their families, as well as adults.
